





CAPTAIN'S INSIGHT: MELANIE GIBSON ON HER FOOTBALL JOURNEY AND SOUTHPORT FC WOMEN'S SEASON AMBITIONS

In this edition, we catch up with Southport FC Women's Captain, Melanie Gibson. From her early start in football to leading the team, Melanie talks about what drives her on the pitch. She shares insights into balancing her role as a nume with her commitment to the game, reflects on a promising pre-season, and discusses the team's ambitions for promotion. Dive in for an insightful read with one of the key figures in the sound.

What position do you play, and what do you enjoy most about it?
I primarily play centre midfield, where I sometimes take on a more defensive or attacking role. What I enjoy most is supporting the defenders, helping to create play, and assisting the strikers in the attack.

What's your earliest football memory?

I started playing for my school when I was about six or seven. We were playing against another primary school, and the Birkdale United manager's daughter was on their tearn. After the match, he asked me to come down to training, so I started with them when I was about eight. I played with the same group of girls until I was 16. One of my favourite memories is scoring the final penalty in a tournament to win the cup.

How do you manage to balance football with your responsibilities as a nurse?

It can be quite difficult since fin a nurse at a hospital. Luckly, I handle the rota, so fin able to schedule training and match days off as much as possible. It's challenging, but I do my best to make it to every training session and game because I genuinely enjoy and love playing.

What improvements have you seen in the team during preseason, and how confident are you about our chances for promotion this season?

Last season was tough, but we've brought in a lot of talented players to strengthen the team. I'm really looking forward to the upcoming season, and our goal is definitely to win the league and secure promotion because I believe we're good enough. Pre-season has been great, we've focused on different playing styles and training techniques that we're incorporating into our matches. We've also had good numbers at both training sessions and friendly matches. Overall, it's been a positive pre-season, and I'm confident it will help us play better, create more chances, score more goals, and improve as a team.

What are your personal goals for this season?

My goal for this season is to score more goals and provide more assists than I did last season. I want to keep showing up consistently every week and contribute to the team's success. My focus is on scoring more goals and helping the team secure promotion.

It is the 17th home encounter between the sides if you include the games played against Hereford United.

Hereford FC were born out of the ashes of Hereford United, a club with a proud history that included the FA Cup giant killers run of 1972 and reaching the third-tier of English football on a number of occasions. Sadly off-the-field issues led to them folding in December 2014.

The new club were placed into the Midland Football League for the 2015/16 season. They were able to play from the historic and characterful Edgar Street, kept The Bulls nickname and were resplendent in

white shirts and black shorts.

Hereford started the season with a 3-0 win against South Shields in front of the day's best attendance of 2888, goals from Montel Gibson, Andy Williams and Yusifu Ceesay sealing all 3 points. Last Saturday they travelled to Chorley and came away with a fine 1-1 draw with new signing Ahkeem Rose grabbing the equalising goal in the 79th minute.

The Bulls were in action again on Tuesday evening when they entertained Peterborough Sports

The points were shared last season with Southport winning 1-0 at Edgar Street through a Marcus Carver goal in what was Jim Bentley's first game in charge. The return saw Hereford take all three points, Carver on the scoresheet again, against a ten man Southport side after Danny Lloyd was shown a rather controversial red card in the 60th minute. Games between the sides do tend to be a touch lively at home and away.

It was controversy all the way here at The Big Help Stadium when the first Hereford goal was given by an eagle eyed Assistant Referee who said the ball had crossed the line. Chris Renshaw in the Southport goal was adamant it hadn't and the photo and video evidence was also inconclusive. It mattered not, the goal was given.





Hereford are managed by Paul Caddis who took over the reins at Hereford in April 2023, Caddis was appointed as manager signing a two-year contract and officially taking charge from 1 May. After guiding Hereford to their highest ever finish and highest points total in the National League North in his first season, Caddis signed a one-year extension to his contract.

OUR VISITORS HEREFORD

Aaron Chapman

Chapman has made appearances for Accrington Stanley, Bristol Rovers, Peterborough United and, more recently, Boston United during his career. At 6ft 8inches tall, Chapman is a dominant physical presence and has obvious experience at both an EFL and a National League North level.

Aaron Skinner

A mainstay of the Bamber Bridge team that reached the play-offs at Step 3 in 2022/23, he was named as their Player of the Season following a highly-consistent campaign.

Strong and adept in a number of different positions, the level-headed defender cut his football teeth at Bury before moving into the youth ranks at Bolton Wanderers, from where he was soon snapped up by Tottenham Hotspur.

His progress was such that he signed his first professional contract with the London club before becoming a regular in their U23 team.

He joined The Bulls in May 2023.

Lewis Hudson

The Coventry born defender joins the Bulls from Rushall Olympic where he has been a consistent starter in the Pic's back line. Hudson was in the Rushall Olympic side that took on the Bulls last week (Tuesday 23rd January) and impressed in a tight and cagey match.

Lewis spent 2 seasons with Redditch United where he proved his worth and earned his move to the National League North.

Aurio Teixeira

The highly-rated youngster was snapped up on a two-year deal in May 2023 following an impressive season at Alvechurch, where he was a regular in the side that enjoyed an exciting FA Cup adventure.

A defensive midfielder, he came through the ranks at West Bromwich Albion where he was known as a ball-winner who was calm and assured on the ball.

The Bulls beat off plenty of competition to secure his services.

Alex Babos

A hard-working and confident central midfielder who joined the club in May 2023 having been a regular in the Banbury United team.

It was at Derby County where he learned his trade and progressed to secure a professional contract in 2016.

He was loaned out to Spanish outfit, Real Union, as well as FC United of Manchester, whilst also getting regular game-

time for The Rams' U23 team.

The Wales U21 International then went on to serve Alfreton Town and King's Lynn Town.

Jason Cowley

A hard-working and lively front-runner who joined The Bulls for an undisclosed fee from Stourbridge in June 2023.

He was a firm favourite with The Glassboys, where he notched 29 goals in 2022-23 on his way to scooping numerous end of season awards.

Having started his career with Redditch Borough, he then joined Bromsgrove Sporting where his record in front of goal brought plenty of higher level attention and it resulted in him moving into The Football League with Stevenage in 2019.

He then joined Macclesfield Town shortly before their sad demise and then returned to Bromsgrove Sporting prior to his switch to Stourbridge in 2021. He has also had loan spells with the likes of Solihull Moors and Kidderminster Harriers.

Andy Williams

Hereford born and bred, 'Willo' started his career with the Bulls at Edgar Street making his mark on the Hereford side that won the play-off final against Halifax Town in 2006. After his departure from the street, Williams went on to have a fantastic career in the Football league playing for the likes of Bristol Rovers and Yeovil Town before his move to Swindon Town where he met the Bulls' new boss, Paul Caddis.

Williams joins us from League 2 side, Walsall where he made 30 appearances last season in all competitions for the Saddlers.

Mark Derricott

The emerging defender put pen-to-paper on a new deal in the summer of 2023 having made good progress from the Under-18 team.

An intelligent performer with plenty of energy, he is a local lad who was given his initial first-team chance during 2022/23, a campaign which also saw him have a couple of loan spells at Hednesford Town as part of his football education.

Adam Rooney

The experienced front-man joined the club in a player-assistant manager role in June 2023.

He moved from his native Ireland during the summer of 2005 to join the youth ranks at Stoke City, where he made pleasing progress and went on to become the club's youngest-ever hat-trick scorer.

Having had loan spells at Yeovil Town and Chesterfield, he made a permanent switch to Inverness Caledonian Thistle



where he graced the Scottish top-flight before returning south of the border with Birmingham City.

Joining Swindon Town on Ioan, as Paul Caddis moved in the opposite direction as part of the deal, he then went on to serve Oldham Athletic, Aberdeen, where he became a firm favourite, Salford City, Solihull Moors. Stratford Town and Brackley Town.

Kyle Howkins

The tall, commanding and athletic defender started his career at West Bromwich Albion, where he progressed through the ranks to sign a professional deal in 2017.

He was loaned out to Kidderminster Harriers, Mansfield Town, Cambridge United and then Port Vale in a bid to gain senior experience over the next few seasons.

Upon leaving The Hawthorns, he joined Newport County in the summer of 2019 but injuries were to halt his progress, as well as the pandemic.

He had a loan spell at Solihull Moors as serious injury was to strike and keep him out of action long-term before he joined The Bulls following a successful trial in July 2023.

Cosmos Matwasa

Cosmos started his career with Anstey Nomads before a move to Stamford FC where he helped The Daniels to a 2nd place finish in the 2021/22 season scoring 10 goals along the way.

He then impressed as a trialist at Brackley Town in the summer of 2022 where he was snapped up by the Saints. Matwasa played a key role in helping Brackley to consecutive play-off finals before being released this summer.

Matt Preston

Preston Started his career at Walsall making over 40 appearances in League One. He then moved to Caddis' former side, Swindon Town where he would make his mark on League Two securing over 100 football league appearances. A more recent move to Kidderminster saw the defender helped the Harriers reach the fourth round of the FA Cup and played a vital role in their journey that ended with a defeat to West Ham.

Chay Tilt

Tilt joins us from Birmingham side, Sporting Khalsa who apply their trade in the Northern Premier League Midland Division. He's a creative and clinical winger that is comfortable playing in central positions.

Chay has previously played for West Bromwich Albion, Queen's Park Rangers, Stourbridge, Tamworth, Redditch, Hednesford, Macclesfield Town, Sporting Khalsa.

Montel Gibson

The ex-League 2 forward joined Notts County aged 18, from where he would spend time on loan at Romulus, Hednesford Town and Sutton Coldfield Town. He would return to League 2 in 2020 with a move to Grimsby Town under manager, Ian Holloway.

More recently Montel has played for Telford United, helping them to reach the play-off final against Leamington.

Tate Campbell

The talented youngster started his career with in the Blues academy at the age of 7 where he spent 9 years. Campbell then made the step up signing his first professional deal at Birmingham City where he would be loaned out to then National League side. Bromley.

Yusifu Ceesav

The pacey winger joins the Bulls' having previously had spells at Blackpool and Kidderminster, as well as two successful stints at Alfreton Town.

He will be no stranger to Hereford FC supporters as he scored the second goal for Alfreton in their 2-1 win at Edgar Street in April 2022. Yusifu will offer us a different threat in wide areas with his pace and direct, positive approach.

After an exciting season with the Bulls getting a total of 19 goal contributions, he's extended his stay at Hereford

Sammy Robinson

Robinson started his youth career at Leeds United before a move to Manchester City's academy in 2016. He made a total of 16 appearances in the Professional Development League, scoring one goal and providing two assists.

After coming out the the City academy, Sammy secured a move to League 2 side, Port Vale where he spent 18 months making 23 appearances at the age of 20. In June 2023, Robinson moved to then National League side, Kidderminster Harriers making 22 appearances under manager Russ Penn.

Preston Bitemo

A young and exciting talent, Preston joins the bulls from Hinckley AFC where he helped The Knitters gain promotion last season after winning the league.

Preston has been on trial with the Bulls throughout preseason even grabbed an assist against Stourbridge.

Lawson D'Ath

The Midfielder joined the Bulls late last season from Banbury United where he helped the Bulls in the remaining 4 games of the season. His experience has shone through and has been vital in controlling games from the middle of the park.

SFC 16-19 Academy

Academy Manager David Morgan

Our players have been back in for pre season training from the beginning of August and it has been great to see them all again, after a deserved rest at the end of a long season.



Our programme this pre season has been fairly intense in terms of the training and the number of games we have arranged but we plan it this way to allow players to get plenty of minutes in their legs.

Our first game of pre season was on Sunday 4th August against OPS FC, who are a men's team and currently play in the Southport and District League. We won the game 6-3 with some fantastic goals coming from Wil Hoey x2, Andrew Cunningham, Will Sullivan, Matty Hawkins and Ollie Wright. There was some exceptional football played that day and the boys were lucky enough to be able to play on the pitch at the Big Help Stadium.

We followed this up in the following mid-week with a game against Steven Gerrard Academy, which was another good test for us. We won the game 4-1 with goals coming from Renato De Oliveira and Dave Osaletin.

Unfortunately, our first defeat of our pre season came against a very good Warrington Rylands side on 11th August and they beat us convincingly 6-0. We found it difficult from the beginning and we found ourselves a goal behind due to a mix up in our defence in the early minutes. From that point on, we struggled, never really recovered and caused all our own problems, but take nothing away from Warrington Rylands who on the day were the far more superior team. Our boys will learn a massive amount from that game and understand that against good opposition, mistakes will get punished.

Our final pre season game before the U21 Development League started was against Southport Hesketh. Final score in this game was a very exciting 2-2 draw. We played extremely well for the first 20 minutes of the game and found ourselves 2-0 up however, we took our foot off the gas, allowed the opposition back into the game and conceded 2 goals.

With us training 3 times a week through pre season, it has afforded us the luxury of plenty of time coaching

on the grass and the ability to integrate all our new players into our squad who have settled extremely well.

Since announcing that we would be involved within The North West U21 Development League, we as staff and players have been eagerly anticipating the first game which was on Sunday 18th August against Preston City. We were dominant for large periods of the game and possibly will see it as a game we should have won comfortably, however, we couldn't put away the chances that we created. 



"When I think back to the time I most enjoyed watching Southport, it's not the fleeting moments of triumph or cup giant killings that necessarily come to mind, but rather a specific era. Therefore, when I pick an XI that I most enjoyed watching, it's a particular group of players from the late 90s.

Even though I've seen more successful teams in terms of silverware and arguably better players in many of these positions, this period holds a special place in my heart so I'm not going to go into any detail whatsoever about why any of these players make this

XI. This XI is personal to me, nobody else.

What truly made this period unforgettable for me, were the memories I created with my dad. We spent countless Saturdays together, discussing tactics, and sharing in the highs and lows of being Southport supporters.

We had only started watching regularly in 1993, so each opposition club was new to both of us, and every away ground was a fresh adventure. Each match and each new signing brought a new wave of possibilities. The hopes of that time were infectious, and they made every match day special, regardless of the result on the pitch. It was a time filled with optimism, a feeling that better times were just around the corner.

I didn't know at the time that I would only get 10 years of going to the game with my dad before he would move away to work in Scotland.

When I look back now, I don't think he ever really considered Southport to be his club, but that didn't matter, he was just enjoying spending time with me. And now 25 years later those memories are priceless. These memories serve as a reminder that football is more than just the game on the pitch. It's about the bonds we form and the people we share our passions with – not money and instant success.

That the success we craved together never really materialised, doesn't take anything away from

the memories. It's the shared experiences and the connections that last a lifetime, so thank you to each of the players that wore an Old Gold shirt and kicked a bag of wind up and down a pitch so that I could spend time with my dad.



FROM THE ARCHIVES

On Tuesday November 12th 1946, the Lancashire Evening Post ran an article about the England football squad who were training at Southport ahead of their game against Wales in the now defunct Home international Championship. The game was played the following day at Maine Road, then home to Manchester City, in front of a crowd of just under sixty thousand and saw England run out 3-0 winners thanks to goals by Wilf Mannion (2) and Tommy Lawton.



The article reported that:

"England's team to play Wales in tomorrow's match at Maine Road, Manchester, are filling their lungs with Southport's ozone.

Austerity is by no means the keynote of their preparation for the international as the players are staying at the deluxe Palace Hotel, Birkdale, recently reopened after use during the war as an American Red Cross club and U.S. Army Air Force rest centre.

In pre-war days this hotel was a popular headquarters for football teams preparing for vital league games or Cup ties, especially Cardiff City in their heyday.

The players in charge of team manager Walter

Winterbottom arrived at the hotel yesterday afternoon and in the evening went to a Southport cinema to see "London Town".




