also our continued desire for bespoke training facilities.



# LEAGUE CUP UPDATE

Southport FC Women have kicked off 2025 with two competitive League Cup group stage fixtures, showing both dominance and resilience as they aim for a place in the sext round. With a commanding 2-0 victory over City of Liverpool and a hard-fought draw against Wirral Phoenix, the team is building momentum for the challenges ahead.

The match against City of Liverpool saw Southport. deliver a well-executed tactical performance, racing to a 2-0 lead within the first 25 minutes. Debutant. Rikuvera Mokaleng made an immediate impact by scoring the opener, showcasing her attacking instincts and composure. Melanie Gibson followed up with a second goal, securing the victory. The match also marked the debuts of Jemma Harding and Freya Wickstead, both of whom slotted into the team seamlessly and contributed to the overall solid performance. Nicole Power was named Player of the Match for her dominant midfield display, controlling possession and driving the team forward.

The second match against Wirral Phoenix proved. to be a tougher challenge. Southport took the lead on thirty seven minutes thanks to another goal from Melanie Gibson, but Wirral responded just. before halftime to level the score. The team created several opportunities to regain the lead but couldn't capitalise. In the dying moments of the match, goalkeeper Emily Norcross made an outstanding save to ensure the draw and secure a crucial point. However, under League Cup rules, drawn matches go to a penalty shootout for a bonus point, which Wirral. claimed. Telgan Cunningham earned the Player of the Match accolade with an outstanding defensive performance.

Looking ahead, Southport are excited about their next League Cup flature against St Heleris Rovers on 9th February, which will be held at the Big Help-Stadium in Southport. The team is looking forward to the opportunity to play in a stadium environment and discussions are ongoing to involve the girls' youth teams in the event. Anticipation is building for what promises to be a memorable occasion.



Congratulations to Nicole, who has been voted Southport FC Women's Player of the Month for December! Nicole's performance. against Formby was a key factor in her earning. this award. Coming on in the first half, she took control of the midfield, turning the game in our favour with her composed and commanding play. # IN THE HOT SEAT

Graeme Lee was appointed as the new First Team Manager of Spennymoor Town in January 2024 after stepping down from his previous role in charge of Marske United.

Born in Middlesbrough into a football family, Graeme Lee went on to carve out a successful playing career in the Football League during which he made over 500 senior appearances.

Hometown club Middlesbrough offered him the opportunity to cut his teeth in coaching with a position in their much-celebrated Academy and Lee never looked back.

He spent over a decade working in various roles within the Boro set-up before being unveiled as Lead Coach for the club's Under-23s in 2019.

However, ambition burned deeply inside and when the opportunity arose for him to take up the challenge as Manager of Hartlepool United in 2021, he could not turn down a return to his former club.

Filling the shoes of promotion-winning boss Dave Challinor was a tough ask, but he got stuck in and led the team to the semi-finals of the EFL Trophy as well as a memorable to the FA Cup Fourth Round where almost 5,000 travelling fans saw them beaten at Premier League Crystal Palace.

His appointment as boss at The Brewery Field means he is following in the footsteps of his legendary father Tony, who was manager of Spennymoor United in the early-2000s.



# OUR VISITORS SPENNYMOOR TOWN

### **Brad James**

Highly rated goalkeeper Brad James signed a new contract at The Brewery Field during the summer after starring for Moors during the second half of the 2023/24 campaign.

Former Middlesbrough youngster James made 15 appearances during the run-in, keeping six clean sheets and tasting defeat just twice as Moors made a late drive towards the play-off positions.

James previously played on loan at Hartlepool United where his dramatic penalty save in the shootout at Ashton Gate in the Play-Off Final won them promotion back to the EFL in 2021.

#### Rvan Johnson

Young goalkeeper Ryan Johnson signed non-contract forms during the summer of 2024 after impressing last term when playing for the Club's Under-18s.

His promise was also rewarded on the international stage during the second half of 2023/24 when the talented teenager was called-up as part of the England Schoolboys squad.

#### **Ben Beals**

Young centre-back Ben Beals became the fifth signing of the 2024 summer when he put pen to paper on a deal at The Brewery Field following his release from Middlesbrough.

The talented defender had been on the books at The Riverside since he was just 9 years old and progressed through the ranks to become a regular in their Under-21s side.

A committed and composed performer, Beals gained senior experience during loan spells at Whitby Town and more recently Marske United where he played under Moors boss Graeme Lee.

#### Michael Ledger

Former Sunderland centre-back Michael Ledger put pen to paper on a deal with Spennymoor Town in August 2022 following a successful trial.

The defender came right through the ranks at The Stadium of Light where he was on the books from the age of just 7 and went on to win a professional contract after captaining the club's Under-18s.

Consett-born Ledger gained further senior experience on loan at Viking in Norway and with Hartlepool United before moving permanently to Norwegian outfit Notodden UK in 2018.

He returned to the UK at the start of 2020 and became a regular for Greenock Morton in the Scottish Championship before his move to Moors.

## Nathan McGinley

Experienced defender Nathan McGinley signed a deal with Moors in the summer of 2024 after returning to his native North East following a spell in Scotland.

The centre-back came through the ranks to sign professional

terms with Middlesbrough in 2015 and made his First Team debut for the club in an EFL Cup tie against Notts County three years later.

#### Dan Myers

Versatile defender Dan Myers joined Moors in January 2024 on a permanent deal to link-up with boss Graeme Lee once again having worked under him at Marske United.

A former Moors Under-18s player, Myers had been one of Marske's star men during the first half of the 2023/24 campaign having signed from Newton Aycliffe in the summer.

Comfortable at left-back or in the centre of defence, Myers can be an asset going forward where his delivery into the box can cause problems for opposition defences.

#### Dan Rowe

Dominant central defender Dan Rowe joined the Club during the summer of 2024 following a five-year spell in the colours of Whitby Town.

A former Rotherham United youngster, Rowe went on to play in the Football League with Wycombe Wanderers for whom he signed permanently in 2015 after a series of successful loan stints at Adams Park.

#### Reece Staunton

Reece Staunton became then boss Jamie Chandler's first signing as Moors boss when he put pen to paper on a contract at The Brewery Field in the summer of 2023.

The versatile youngster was a free agent after spending 2022/23 on the books at Bradford (Park Avenue) and quickly emerged as one of Moors' top transfer targets.

Comfortable in the centre of defence, left-back or even in midfield, Staunton came through the ranks at Bradford City where he started out at just 11-years-old.

His debut season with Moors proved to be a memorable one as the young defender claimed Players' Player, Supporters' Player and the Management Team's Player of the Year awards after a catalogue of outstanding performances.

#### **Matty Dolan**

Vastly experienced midfielder Matty Dolan joined Moors on a permanent deal in February 2024 following his departure from Hartlepool United.

Dolan has over 400 games at EFL level under his belt having played the majority of his career in League One and League Two. As well as his playing role, Dolan has taken up coaching duties

within Moors' Academy.

Versatile midfielder Olly Dyson was signed in July 2023 on a half-season loan deal from National League outfit York City.



A former Huddersfield Town youngster, Dyson joined The Minstermen in 2020 and played a crucial role in their promotion from National League North.

His standout performances for City not only earned him a callup for England C, but also the coveted Clubman of the Year award in 2022/23.

#### Mitch Hancox

Experienced midfielder Mitch Hancox joined the Club on a permanent deal in January 2025 following his departure from fellow National League North outfit Chester.

The Solihull-born schemer came through the ranks at Birmingham City where he turned professional and went on to make 40 appearances before moving on to Macclesfield Town in 2016.

#### Corev McKeown

Moors completed the signing of youngster Corey McKeown in November 2022 when an undisclosed fee was paid to Blyth Spartans for the attacking star's services.

McKeown had been on the books at Croft Park since he was 17, bursting on to the scene and securing the Young Player of the Year award after some dazzling performances.

The young winger enjoyed a real breakthrough at The Brewery Field during the second half of 2023/24 when he became a regular in the side and began creating and scoring goals.

## **Rob Ramshaw**

Talented midfielder Rob Ramshaw arrived at The Brewery Field in the summer of 2016 following his departure from Gateshead and is now among Moors longest-serving players.

Ramshaw has been a key component in the club's success over recent years and he wrote his name into the history books when he scored the Play-Off Final winner against Stourbridge in 2017.

His consistent and dominant displays have ensured he has remained a regular in the side and his lively and infectious character makes him a popular member of the squad.

#### Callum Ross

Highly rated midfielder Callum Ross joined Spennymoor Town in January 2023 when the Club paid an undisclosed fee to South Shields for his services.

Most comfortable in a deep lying central midfield berth, Ross had spent the previous three years at Mariners Park where his performances had made him a big favourite with supporters.

Ross enjoyed another strong season during 2023/24, battling back from a hamstring injury to play a big role in the run-in before putting pen to paper on a new contract at The Brewery Field in the summer.

## **Finley Shrimpton**

Talented midfielder Finley Shrimpton returned to The Brewery Field for a second spell on loan with the club from Scunthorpe United in November 2024.

The young midfield man made a big impression during his time on loan during the second half of the 2023/24 campaign and fans were delighted to see him return to County Durham.

#### Will Harris

Young front man Will Harris joined Spennymoor Town in the summer of 2023 following his departure from National League outfit Gateshead.

The South Shields born striker was on the books at Burnley and Hebburn Town during his youth before earning a move to Sunderland in 2020.

Harris enjoyed a wonderful debut season at The Brewery Field, smashing home 16 goals in National League North as he struck up a good understanding with Moors legend Glen Taylor in attack.

### Junior Mondal

Exciting attacker Junior Mondal became the third signing of the summer when he agreed terms on a move to The Brewery Field following his departure from Whiby Town.

Another graduate of Middlesbrough's famed Academy, Mondal joined The Teessiders when he was just 11 and went on to take up a scholarship with the club in 2013.

Comfortable in attack or out wide, Mondal earned a move to the EFL with Forest Green Rovers in 2019 and also played for AFC Fylde and Darlington before playing under Moors boss Graeme Lee at Marske United.

#### Glen Taylor

Legendary front man Glen Taylor has not only written himself into Spennymoor Town history in recent years but also carved out a reputation as one of the hottest properties in non-league. With over 100 Moors goals to his name, the fans' favourite also passed 350 appearances for the Club last term and continues to strike fear into opposition defences up and down the land.

Capable of poaching or producing the spectacular, Taylor's consistent performances have seen him scoop a number of Player of the Year accolades since joining Moors in 2017.

Taylor's goalscoring exploits show no signs of slowing down as he struck 20 goals again in 2022/23 before top-scoring with 17 in all competitions last term despite missing three months of the season after knee surgery.

The legendary front man finished 2023/24 just 14 goals shy of 200 in a Spennymoor shirt, and he will have his eyes firmly fixed on that incredible landmark after penning a new two-year deal during the summer.

# HEREFORD REPORT

# My first time on the train to Hereford and a good day out.

I left the house at 8.45am and back home for 9pm so a long day but nearly all the travel was perfect apart from the last leg from Liverpool to Ainsdale which saw Merseyrail at their best although to be fair the delay was only short but nobody seemed to know what was going on which was the annoying part and Liverpool Central platforms were heaving.

The trip down involved Ainsdale to Liverpool, Liverpool to Crewe and Crewe to Hereford on a Transport for Wales train that was going to Cardiff and had the announcements in Welsh. I was very tempted to record one and send to Julia saying I had gone wrong but thought better of it.

The journey down did remind me of the Football League days when we went to Swansea and Newport by train passing through Craven Arms, Ludlow, Leominster, Shrewsbury etc

I arrived in Hereford at 12.40 and went straight to the ground. For those of you keeping track of my fish and chip shop visits sadly nothing to report, it had been a packed lunch on the train for this one.

Having had a few issues at Hereford about getting in early in the past I had asked in advance to make sure it would be ok. To be fair the welcome this time was excellent and they couldn't have been more helpful. Maybe they have read my previous reports from Hereford!!!

It was my tenth visit to Edgar Street and the record now stands at Won 4 Drawn 4 Lost 2 which isn't too bad really. The best memory is the 2005-06 game when the Trust was just starting off and we organised two coaches to go to what was a vital game.

It ended 1-1 with Liam Blakeman grabbing a late goal that virtually secured our place in Conference National for another season.

Last season's game saw a 1-0 win in what was Jim's first game in charge and after Danny Lloyd had given us the lead it looked like it could be another win but the lead only lasted 4 minutes and after that it could have gone either way. 1-1 at the end.

The gate of 2490 was the fifth time we have played in front of a 2000+ gate this season, the others have come at home to Marine 2464, Drew 0-0, away at Kidderminster 2503 lost 2-0, away at Chester 2711 drew 0-0 and away at Southend United in the Trophy 3113 lost 1-0.

The 2000+ "curse" goes on but it's not that bad, we did win at Hereford last season in front of a gate of 2259.

There were a recorded 50 away fans in attendance who had used trains and cars to get there from various parts of the country. I am sure I spotted a few more in the home stand as well,

We had both intended to do commentary and Joe did but he had forgotten to bring the proper Comms box with him so he had to go solo and a fine job he did.

I had to make a quick dash to the station after the game I wasn't on a booked train but wanted to make sure I was in plenty of time. As it happened I actually got on a late running train that was going to Manchester via Crewe which because I hadn't booked specific seats worked out well. It had come up from Fishguard and once again the announcements were in Welsh. Change at Crewe and on the Liverpool train home. Quite a straightforward one really.



This picture shows the change at the ground behind the goal that has always been derelict for as long as I can remember. The stand that was there has now been removed.



This is the stand were the visiting fans are housed in the upper tier fourth block from the left. Very strange segregation in place I believe, If you needed the toilet or wanted some food you have to walk to the home end of the ground in front of the home fans. I can only assume when Kidderminster sold out their allocation of tickets different arrangements were in place or it could have got a bit lively.

A Dad's Army of volunteers providing a 4th Emergency Service.

Part 2 - All hands to the decks

In part one Craig the baby of the Ground Crew (in his mid-60's) painted a picture as to what he and fellow Ground Crew volunteers do on a matchday. Here he fills us in on what other unseen work they do when the ground is closed.

Normally they go in on a Monday and Wednesday, with each volunteer playing his role. When Fred Menzies, Rod Henderson, Robert Carr and Ken Rimmer start by emptying and cleaning the bins, as well as sweeping the stands after a match. They will also sweep up any leaves on the terraces and pick up litter to make the ground tidy for the next game. Whilst Tony Birrell will be edging the pitch and trying to keep the weeds down, he is partnered with his dog Poppy. The 4-legged friend is an honorary member of the team and is often seen at away games.

Andy Morison will turn his hand to anything but specialises in repairing the terraces, continually battling against the moss and weeds with pesticides. Craig credits Andy as the fittest in the crew. The camaraderie between all of them is strong and when they take a break for a brew they put the world to rights.

I had previously mentioned that many of the jobs the crew perform are unglamourous yet essential. So, it's not uncommon they have to repair any damage to the toilets and unblock urinals. Craig informed me that it takes him over 90 minutes to go around the ground replacing the toilet rolls paper towels and hand wash in the toilets each week.

Thankfully since the Big Help Group (BHG) have come on board, they help the crew with

the more difficult jobs as Dave Barnes an exjoiner is the only qualified tradesman amongst them. With the increased signage around the ground his skills are well used when erecting the advertising boards in pre-season or repairing then as the season goes on. He is also known to go onto the roof of the stand to retrieve wayward clearances of centre halves!

Nowadays the crew leave the removal of pigeons that get trapped in the netting of the main stand to the younger and more agile staff of the BHG.

Another crew member is a young sprightly 90-year-old Brian Anderson, who's association goes back 70 years with the club, having appeared in our reserves. The ex-postie is the designated head painter for the terraces and outside the ground.

Any of the floodlights that may require repairs or bulbs replaced will be carried out on a Sunday by the crew. Throughout the week the boilers will also be regularly checked.

At the time of interviewing Craig, it was just before the Leamington game which was postponed. Both he and Dave where at the Big Help Stadium the day before at 8.30am to help with the pitch inspection. Is there no limits to what commitment they show?

The total man hours each week that the crew "lads" (average age mid 70's) dedicated to the club is amazing.

Most of the work is completely behind the scenes, unseen. They will do whatever is required, mainly outside in all weather conditions. Their tasks are varied, at times unpleasant vet essential. So, the next time vou have a gripe about the ground, instead of moaning on 'Port Chat, consider contacting Dave or Craig, as they could always do with an extra pair of hands and have plenty of spare gloves!

Thanks to all nine of you, you are the 4th emergency service to the club.





Centre back Phil Bolland, who just scrapes into my line up in front of Jack Higgins (gee whiz) Classy player, once described I seem to remember as having telescopic legs! Could cover the ground effortlessly. Disgracefully allowed to leave for nothing.

Midfield Dave Gamble Scaffolder by trade (at the time) and one of the best "left foots" I've ever seen in a Southport FC shirt. His free kicks were a speciality but scored direct from corners too. Penalties a given. What a player.



Midfield Tony Quinn I feel sorry for anybody who missed this lad in a Southport FC shirt. Oozed skill and should (and would today) I believe have played at a higher level. He wouldn't be chasing back 50 vards to track runners OR defend but he was such a talent. A player before "his time" if you know what I mean? Related to Mick Quinn who played league football for Newcastle Utd. Coventry City amongst others.



Forward Shaun Whalley What a player, who again has gone onto have a great Football League career-unfortunately not with Southport FC! Worth the entrance fee every week he played. Pace to burn, and one of the many players that Liam Watson brought through to help fulfil their talent.



Forward Steve Daly Centre forward-and centre halves knew it! Great centre forward in the true sense of the word. A target man if ever there was one and would "die for the cause" A member of both of Liam's Championship winning teams in 2005 and 2010. Such a shame he didn't quite get the all time goal scoring record at SFC. as IMHO it would have been fully deserved.



Forward Steve Whitehall Another skilful pacey left sided forward signed originally by Brian Kettle in the early 90's? Terrific attitude and some brilliant memories of some of his goals. Arguably part of the Port's revival in the late eighties/early nineties winning trophies at Maine Road and Goodison Park. Rewarded again by another great Football League career, primarily at Rochdale FC where I suspect he's still a legend! Signed there at the time by manager and my second cousin Dave Sutton.



# FROM THE ARCHIVES

# **Billy Glover**

History maker, record setter

# "Truly, one of our own"

John William "Billy " Glover was born and bred in Southport. In the 1901 census he was living in Norwood Avenue, by 1911 he lived at no 22 Pitt Street and his occupation was recorded as a grocer. At the age of 24 in the 1921 census he was married living at no 91 Bispham Road with his trade recorded as a motor driver. Little did we know at the time that this local lad would become a Southport legend by making history and setting records.

Playing local schoolboy and district league football, for St Pauls, Maple Crescent (in one game scoring 12 goals) and Blowick Working Lads. Lancaster Town was anxious for his signature and played a single game for them, in which he scored. However, he was to sign for his hometown team and made 3 appearances in the 1919-20 season. The following season he was a regular making 33 appearances and scoring 16 goals, having played in 4 di erent positions.



The 1921/2 season was our first ever league season. Billy Glover was to create history by becoming our first ever league goal scorer in the 1-1 draw with Durham City. The Southport Guardian where to describe that historic goal as follows: "After all the hard luck, the equaliser came and somehow luckily. Skinner with

fine judgement had dodged Carr and turned the ball behind the Durham defenders, Glover got his head to the ball, which flew high into the air and its downwards course struck the upright and deflected into the net. Patchete not having the slightest chance to save, although he made a great e ort"

Having created history, within 2 months Billy was to create a club record that has now stood for over 100 years. In our 7 - 1 win over Grimsby Town he was to score a double hat trick - 6 goals, the highest number of individual goals scored by a player in a single game. At the end of the game the police protected him from the fans carrying their hero o the pitch to the dressing room. He finished our first league season with 26 goals.

In January 1923 he was transferred to Wigan Borough for a fee £1200 (£75,000 in today's monetary value). Having played 54 games and scoring 33 goals during his Southport career.

In the 1924/5 season at Wigan Borough, he was top scorer with 16 goals, though in the penultimate game he broke his leg. He was only to play twice more the following season as he never recovered from the injury e ectively ending his career.

Billy after his career was to become a well-known taxi driver in the town and died at the age of 65 in the place of his birth.

Befittingly our first ever league goal and most goals in a game record belongs to a Sandgrounder, truly one of our own!

It was our 100th game in the competition as a NL side, we did play in the competition 65 times as a Football League side and also had 3 games before entering the Football League.

Our Liverpool Senior Cup NL record reads played 100 Won 51 Drawn 14 Lost 35 Goals For 207 Against 158

The biggest wins have been a 7-0 against Warrington Town in 1996/97 and we had a 7-1 against Formby in 2003-04 with bot Carl Baker and Steve Daly grabbing a hat-trick.

The biggest defeat came at Skelmersdale in 2009-10 7-0 when to be fair we did field a weakened squad. The captain that night was our youngest ever, Sam Finley, he didn't do too badly in his career after that did he!

We have won the competition on five occasions:

1990-91 v Marine at Goodison won 4-0

1992/93 v Burscough at Goodison won 2-0

1998/99 v Burscough at Haig Ave won 6-3

2010/1 v Everton at Haig Ave won 2-0

 $2018\text{-}19\,\text{v}$  Prescot Cables at Prescot 0-0 won on pens.

The lowest attendance saw just 73 turn out at Haig Ave for the game against Cammell Laird in 2016-17.

Apart from finals the best was the amazing 1604 at Marine in 2022-23 which took most of us by surprise.

We play Warrington Rylands here at Haig Ave in the Quarter Finals on a date to be confirmed.
