

SOUTHFORT FOOTBALL CLUE

Today's Visitors Notts County

hroughout the years Notts have moved between the Divisions on no less than 26 occasions. In recent times the club have had just two spells at the highest level in English football, between 1981-1984 and for one season only, 1991-1992 in the last season of Division One it was re-named 'The Premiership'.

Notts County's most famous player was the England International Tommy Lawton, whose arrival at Meadow Lane in November 1947 put 10,000 on the gate and the Boxing Day game against Swansea caused the gates to be locked with more than 45,000 in the ground and an estimated 10,000 outside! 'The Lawton Era' were halcyon days at Notts County with other great players such as Jackie Sewell and Tommy Deans gracing the Third Division.

Arguably the most successful period in the Club's history, under arguably the most successful manager, came in the 1970s when Jimmy Sirrel put so much pride back into the Club including promotion to Division One in 1981.

Later, Neil Warnock became only the second manager in recent times to steer Notts to the top flight in 1991. After just one season at that level the club have spent most of the nineties fighting to establish consistency. Season 1997-98 however was quite unique with a

number of national and club records falling as Notts County surged to the Third Division Championship.

During a campaign which saw the club become the first to pass the 4,000 League games landmark, Sam Allardyce's team won a League Championship at the earliest ever date (March 18th) and by the largest number of points (19).

The Meadow Lane Stadium, Notts home since 1910, has been completely rebuilt during the early 1990s at a cost of £8 million and currently has a capacity of 20,300 all seated, boasting some of the best facilities outside of the Premiership.



GOALKEEPERS

STEVE MILDENHALL – Born Swindon 13.5.78 – Height 6'4". One of the new recruits brought in by manager Jocky Scott last summer, is one of the brightest stars in the Nationwide League. A former Player of the Year at his native Swindon (despite only playing for half the season) Notts moved quickly to secure his signature despite reported interest from Sunderland and Arsenal. Started last season brightly but a dip in form allowed Stuart Garden to take over the number one spot. Will be looking to start the season afresh.

STUART GARDEN - Born Dundee 10.2.72 - Height 5'11". Another keeper brought to the club by Jocky Scott when both Darren Ward and Paul Gibson left the club. Was expected to fill a supporting role at the club to Steve Mildenhall, but when called upon Garden made a string of impressive saves in the run-in to contribute as much as anyone to the club avoiding relegation.

SAUL DEENEY - Young goalkeeper who is in the second year of a four-year contract; testament to the club's hopes for the young Irishman. Although yet to make a first team appearance for the Magpies, Saul is highly regarded at the club.

DEFENDERS

DANNY STONE - A former trainee at Ewood Park, Notts quickly snapped up the young defender on a one-year contract after he was released by Blackburn Rovers and he earned a twelve month extension at the end of the season. Although Danny was expected to spend the first year gaining experience at reserve level, his impressive performances persuaded Gary Brazil to give the full-back his debut against Reading. A very composed young player who looks to have a bright future, and is yet to have a poor game for the first team.

RICHARD LIBURD - Born Nottingham 26.9.73 - Height 5'9". Very much a talisman for the club and one of the crowd favourites, Richard Liburd has cemented his place in the squad as a player able to fill in numerous positions, and has also revealed a talent for scoring crucial goals. Returned to the team in the relegation run-in last season to great effect and will once more begin the season as one of the senior players many will look to.

IAN BARACLOUGH – Born Leicester 4.12.1970 – Height 6'1". Experienced defender who returned to The Aaron Scargill Stadium for the 2001/02 season after a spell with QPR. Able to play in any left-sided role in defence (and also operate in midfield), lan is a very experienced player. He can supplement the attack with a willingness to get forward, and can chip in with the odd goal. Finished the season with injury problems and will be looking to start the new campaign fully fit.

RICHARD HOLMES – Born Grantham 7.11.80 – Height 5' 11". After making a big impact in the right-back berth in season 1999/2000, Richard failed to establish himself in the side last season, with Nicky Fenton's arrival at the club pushing him further down the pecking order. Spent a period on loan last season at Hereford, where the club hope Richard will regain some confidence and challenge for a spot in the Magples' team this season.

NICKY FENTON - Born Preston 23.10.1979 - Height 5' 10". Signed from Manchester City last season for £150,000, Nicky was actually in his second term with Notts after a loan spell the previous season. A very pacey, composed defender who slotted into the side last season with consummate ease and is hugely popular with the fans. His performances belie his young years and is one of the club's main performers, able to operate in the centre or on the right hand side of the defence with great ability. Crucial in last season's team, many will be hoping that his obvious talent is ignored once again by clubs in the top flight.

CRAIG IRELAND - Born Dundee 19.11.1975 - 6'3". Signed by former manager Jocky Scott, Craig is a tough centre-back whose aerial ability enables him to snuff out the opposition's threat in the air, initially joined the Magpies in the 200/01 season on loan, but it seemed a permanent deal would be scuppered when the two clubs could not agree on a fee. Eventually an agreement was reached, and Ireland started last season with some composed performances. A nononsense performer with a lot of strength, and after an injury to lan Richardson formed a strong alliance with both Mark Warren and Nicky Fenton.

PAUL RILEY – Born Nottingham 29.9.1982 - A product of the club's youth system, Paul recently found himself in the side after injury to lan Baraclough. The young defender is very composed on the ball and has confidence with the ball at his feet. Highly-rated by Billy Dearden, the youngster is beginning to establish himself in the squad and it will not be long before he is challenging Baraclough and Nicholson for the left-back slot.

KEVIN NICHOLSON - Born Derby 2.10.1980 - Height 5'8". Began his career with Sheffield Wednesday, but found it difficult to force his way into the team and subsequently joined Northampton on loan. Unfortunately, the Cobblers failed to secure Nicholson to a contract and Notts were able to pip them to the player's signature after he impressed against the Magples in a game at The Aaron Scargill Stadium last season. A player who can deputise anywhere on the

left hand side of the team, Nicholson was not having the best of seasons when injuries to Paul Riley and lan Baraclough meant a spot in the left-back berth, Enjoyed his best period for the side and has staked a very strong claim to start the season as first choice. His goal in the last game of the season against Huddersfield, ensuring Division Two safety, will certainly have helped his cause.

MIDFIELDERS

PAUL BOLLAND – Born Bradford 23.12.79 – Height 6'0". Spent another season ravaged with injury last time out, but showed once again that few can match his work rate and commitment to the side. Paul's never-say-die attitude has made him popular with Billy Dearden and if he can avoid the injury problems which have dogged him recently, may well start the season alongside Darren Caskey.



DARREN CASKEY - Born Basildon 21.8.1974 - Height 5'8". Arrived at the Aaron Scargill Stadium with a lot of expectation on his shoulders, and it might be fair to say that Darren took a while to settle in before his obvious talent came to the fore. Took on the captaincy late in the season and his ability to dictate a game came

to prominence. Fans will be hoping that Caskey can continue where he left of in the last campaign and his passing range will be crucial to the Magpies promotion aspirations.

MARCEL CAS – Born Holland 30.4.1972 – Height 5'11". Arrived in the summer of 2002 from RBC Roosendal. A right-sided player who can operate in midfield or defence, Marcel's willingness to run at players and his impressive turn of speed certainly gained him a reputation in Division Two. Suffered a dip in form mid-season but crucially returned to his best in the relegation dog-fight, attacking relentlessly down the right-hand side and bagging a forty-yard volley at the Withdean Stadium against Brighton – the supporters choice for Goal of the Season.

MICHAEL BROUGH - Born Nottingham - Height 5'9". Another player who will give his all for the side, Michael was again impressive when called upon last season. Will be challenging Paul Bolland for a place in the middle of the park this time around, with his determination and tough-tackling the equal of Bolland, manager Billy Dearden will have to split hairs to decide between the two.

STRIKERS



MARK STALLARD - Born Derby 24,10,74 - Height 6'0". After a season in which he proved his reputation as one of the finest strikers in Division Two, Stallard spent a frustrating 2001/02 trying to shake off a hernia injury that denied Gary Brazil, and subsequently Billy Dearden, his obvious scoring talent. Played

through the pain barrier to little avail, Stallard went under the surgeon's knife before returning to a rapturous reception in the final game of the season. With a fully fit Stallard and Heffernan and Allsopp, few clubs will be able to match the scoring threat of the Magpies.

TONY HACKWORTH – Born Durham 19.05.1980 – Height 6'2". Arrived at The Anron Scargill Stadium with a lot of expectation last season, but was the odd man out with Paul Heffernan developing such a good understanding with Danny Allsopp. Performed consistently in the reserves but was never able to dislodge the young striking duo. Will be hoping for better luck this time around.



DANNY ALLSOPP – Born Australia 10.8.1978 – Height 6'1". Despite playing in a side that struggled for most of the season, Danny still managed to notch up over 30 goals. Shouldered a lot of responsibility with the loss of Mark Stallard, and despite a dip in form over Christmas, was still on hand to fire the Magpies to Division Two

safety. His talents have understandably drawn attention from the higher divisions, and if Billy Dearden can keep hold of him, promises yet another season of free-scoring.

PAUL HEFFERNAN – Born Dublin 29.12.1981 -Height 5'10". Has been touted for two years as a star of the future, and when Mark Stallard suffered injury, Heffernan grabbed his chance with both hands. Despite his age, Heffernan possesses maturity far beyond his years and is as cool as they come in front of goal. Scored a goal against Bristol City that Paul Gascoigne would have been proud of, and after such a long period waiting for his chance, Heffernan will begin the season very much part of the first team squad.



MAINLY ABOUT THE MEMORIES OF THE MAGPIES

ean Howell must have been the happiest person in the Vice-Presidents' Bar when the F.A. Cup draw paired the 'Port with Notts County, 'Deano', who has become a firm favourite with the Haig Avenue fans, began his career at Meadow Lane although he was restricted to just one substitute appearance against Scunthorpe United on 22nd January, 2000. Deano is one of ten players to have appeared for both clubs. The first player to do so was centre-half Jack Wren who was transferred to Notts County from Bristol City in 1922 and in his first season was captain of the team that won the Second Division Championship. He was freed after four seasons at Meadow Lane having played in 63 League games. He arrived at Haig Avenue carrying a leg injury in August 1926 and was released after playing in just six matches three months later.

George Wyness was considered one of the most promising centre-halves in the country before he broke his leg in February, 1931. George went on to make 88 appearances for Southport and later had League experience with Chester and Rochdale before joining Notts County in May, 1936. Although appointed captain he played in only 10 games for the Magpies. Jimmy Proudfoot, an inside-forward or wing-half, signed for Notts County from Barnsley in July, 1932. He managed only ten games for both County and Southend United from whom he joined Southport. He spent two seasons at Haig Avenue making 67 League appearances and scoring twice. Charlie Reed was one of the finest inside-forwards Southport ever had and was very strong with a remarkable burst of speed. Charlie went from Southport to Chesterfield. Signed by the Magpies from Mansfield Town in May, 1938 where he developed into a left-half playing 38 games for County and scoring twice, having notched nine goals in 35 games for Southport.

One of Southport's most popular and wholehearted players was Trevor Hitchen who joined Notts County, then managed by Major Frank Buckley, as a part-time professional while a Bevin Boy at Flamborough Main Colliery in Barnsley in 1945. Although he didn't play for the Magpies in the Football League he had 247

League games with Southport scoring 34 goals and is still a regular spectator at Haig Avenue. Bill Bellas made 88 appearances for the Sandgrounders between 1949 and 1951. Bill had turned professional with Notts County during the War and also turned out for Nottingham Forest.

Another of Major Buckley's Boys was Peter Harrison who played for Notts County as an amateur for a spell from 1944 before being called up into the forces without breaking into their League team. On his return to civilian life he became re-united with Major Buckley at Leeds United. This fleet-footed winger later played for Bournemouth and Reading before concluding his League career with three seasons at Southport making 401 League appearances in all - 126 with the 'Port. Terry Harkin was signed by Southport from Notts County in August 1967 for £2,000. He made 28 appearances and scored ten goals for them before becoming the first Southport player to be capped Internationally for 37 years when selected to play for Northern Ireland against Turkey and Wales. After scoring 31 goals in 63 games (+ 1 sub) he was transferred to Shrewsbury Town for £10,000.

Keith Pring was also an International being capped by Wales when playing for Rotherham United for whom he played four seasons before going to Notts County in an exchange deal with Dave Watson. At Haig Avenue he played 48 consecutive appearances, largely at outside left, before a broken leg at Brentford ended his career. He had previously made 41 appearances (+ 2 sub) and scored two goals for County. Keith still lives locally and has been employed as North West Sales Manager for Bass for a number of years.

Now here's a coincidence! Southport's last home win in the F.A. Cup against Football League opposition was on 9th December 1967 when they beat Lincoln City 3-1 with Eric Redrobe (2) and George Andrews scoring. On the same day Notts County lost at Runcorn - their last defeat against non-league opposition. Southport went on to beat Runcorn in the next round before losing 1-0 at home to Everton, the eventual Cup winners.

Southport and Notts County met ten times in the Fourth Division with honours even - each side winning four and drawing twice. Surprisingly

Southport were undefeated in the six meetings between the two sides in the mid sixties with the Magpies getting the "double" in 1959-60 and 1970-71. A young Tony Hateley scored twice in County's 4-1 win at Meadow Lane in April 1960 and he also scored both goals on his return to the club in his side's 2-0 win at Haig Avenue in November 1970.

The last time the teams met was in the Football League Cup 30 years ago when Notts County beat Southport 3-2 at Meadow Lane on 6th September 1972. County ran up a three-goal lead inside the first 36 minutes through Dave Needham, Mann and John Cozens. Micky Moore's 40th minute goal led to Southport's fight back. Moore was desperately

unlucky in the 59th minute when he beat three men and his shot struck the bar. Andy Provan made it 3-2 nine minutes from time and the 'Port might have had a last minute penalty but after consulting a linesman the referee gave a free-kick to Southport on the edge of the area after Jim Fryatt had been brought down. The Magpies went on to reach the quarter-finals beating First Division, Southampton and Stoke City before losing 3-1 at Chelsea. They also finished runners-up to Bolton Wanderers in the Third Division. Southport gained their greatest triumph by winning the Fourth Division Championship.


